With exceptional water resources, excellent soils, and strong forage capacity, Redwater Creek Ranch is a practical working ranch with substantial upside for an investor, operator, or recreational buyer.

The landscape features a blend of approximately 90± acres of irrigated alfalfa meadows, deep, productive soils, native grasslands, and riparian habitat shaded by mature cottonwoods. The remaining acreage rolls gently through native pastureland, offering excellent forage and grazing paddocks. Cross fencing and the natural terrain support effective rotational grazing and habitat preservation. The land is under a conservation easement designed to protect its natural integrity while allowing continued agricultural use, ensuring long-term stewardship of this unspoiled landscape.



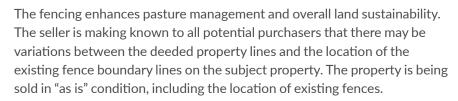




Improvements

While the property's true value lies in its land and water, it includes:

- An older home with potential for renovation or replacement
- A 40' x 80' pole barn with electricity
- A large wooden barn and several smaller outbuildings
- County maintained road access
- Perimeter fencing (with the exception of the north boundary) and internal cross fencing

For the avid outdoorsman, Redwater Creek Ranch is a personal paradise. The creek is teeming with aquatic life, providing excellent fly-fishing opportunities for brook and brown trout. Quiet stretches shaded by cottonwoods give way to riffles and pools where fish hold beneath undercut banks—a dream setting for anyone who knows the difference between a roll cast and a reach cast.

Whitetail deer, Merriam's turkeys, and waterfowl frequent the fields and streamside cover. With its natural food sources, cover, and water, the ranch offers exceptional hunting and wildlife viewing throughout the year. Whether you're stalking with a bow or simply glassing the hills from a porch chair with morning coffee, this land rewards patience and presence.









Agriculture

With approximately 90± acres of irrigated alfalfa, deep, productive soils, and strong water resources, this is a fully functional ranching operation. The remaining acreage—native pastureland—rolls gently through the landscape, offering excellent forage and cross-fenced grazing paddocks.

The live water of Redwater Creek, along with existing fencing and access roads, makes for seamless rotational grazing and hay production. For those looking to run cattle or simply maintain agricultural status, the land offers both form and function.

Water/Mineral Rights & Natural Resources

Redwater Creek, a year-round stream, is the centerpiece of the ranch. It flows consistently through the property, providing natural irrigation, livestock water, and riparian wildlife habitat. This reliable water source supports hay production, cattle operations, and outdoor recreation.

Two wells provide reliable water sources, in addition to the year-round creek for both the homeplace and livestock. A well-share agreement is in place to provide water to a neighboring property.

Any mineral rights currently owned by the seller will convey with the sale. The land is zoned for agriculture, supporting a favorable property tax structure.

General Operations

With its combination of irrigated hay ground and productive pasture, the ranch supports a practical ranching operation. It offers strong forage capacity, seamless grazing rotation, and functional infrastructure to support livestock and hay production.

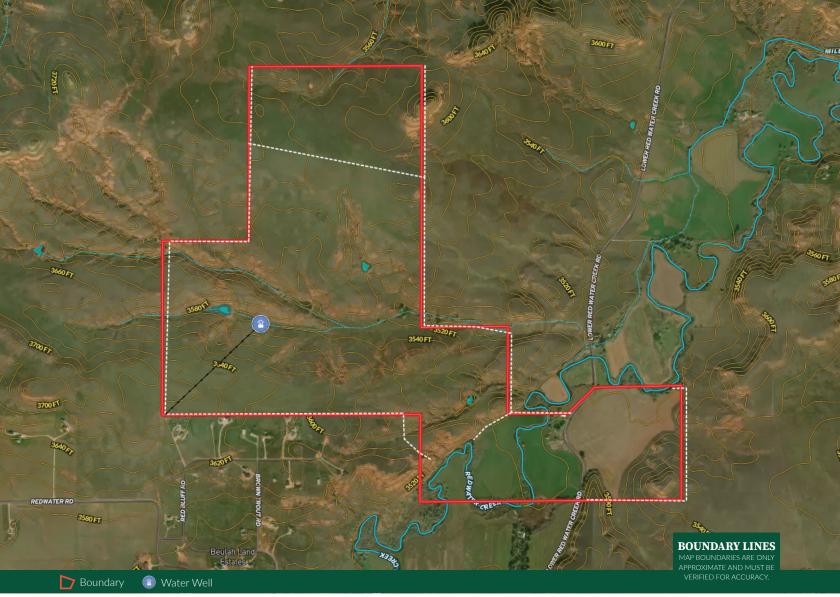
