This 60-acre property is contingent on township approval for a parcel split of the original 100 + /- acre family farm. Note: The owners will consider selling the whole farm (100 + /- acres, home, barn, etc.,) and other potential parcel splits that offer more frontage on Hagerman Road and Bordman Road.

Bordman Valley Farm has over 300 feet of main road frontage and offers very easy access to Rochester Road to the west and M-53 to the east. A perfect mix of productive tillable ground combined with mature hardwood timber makes this property so well-suited for the ultimate sprawling estate with a wide range of other productive uses, from growing crops, to grazing cattle or horses across the healthy grass pastures.

Recreation

Endless recreational opportunities on the Bordman Valley Farm property! This pristine property is rich in wildlife and offers excellent deer, turkey, and waterfowl hunting. Sandhill cranes and a variety of wild birds are frequent visitors. For horse lovers, it borders the Polly Ann Trail—designated a Pure Michigan Trail in 2019—offering 14.2 miles of non-motorized path through Oakland County, with an additional 20 miles extending north into Lapeer County. Ideal for horseback riding, hiking, and mountain biking.

Just 5 miles south is Lakeville Lake, a 460-acre all-sports lake with public access, offering great fishing for bass, panfish, pike, and walleye. Nearby recreation includes Heather Hills Golf Course (2 miles southeast) and Copper Hills Golf Course (8 miles away), a top-rated 27-hole course with the highest elevation in Southeast Michigan.

Agriculture

The rolling meadows on this property feature approximately 35+/- acres of highly fertile tillable ground with great drainage. The tillable ground is easily accessible from the main road. A high percentage of the timber on the property is mature and valuable. Lush native grasses throughout the property.

Region & Climate

Oakland County, Michigan gets 33 inches of rain, on average, per year. The US average is 38 inches of rain per year. Oakland County averages 37 inches of snow. Over the course of the year, the temperature typically varies from 17° F to 82° F and is rarely below 1° F or above 90° F.

Location

Oakland County is considered one of the best places to live in Michigan! The nearby Village of Leonard, a small town tucked into the northeastern corner of Oakland County, is 2.5 miles to the south. The property is 15 miles north of the very popular downtown Rochester, Michigan. The village of Dryden is 6 miles to the north, and the town of Almont is 6 miles to the northeast. The area offers nearby convenience of restaurants, grocery shopping and gas stations plus medical facilities and pharmacy.

Located 31 miles from Oakland County International Airport, 45 miles from Bishop International Airport in Flint and 59 miles to Detroit Metropolitan Airport.
















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
